

**How to claim a Geocoin:**

1. Complete this Passport by visiting at least 15 of the listed sites and recording either the code word found on the cache box and in the log book or answering a question for the virtual sites (listed as "HBCV01-10").
2. Submit the Passport to:

 Between 1:30 and 6pm on May 6, 2017 or during business hours after that date

**How to enter the prize drawing:**

1. Find all 27 traditional and virtual challenge caches and record the words and answers. (If any sites become unavailable, the organizers will remove them from the requirements.)
2. Turn in the completed Passport to Visit Corvallis no later than May 23rd, 2017 with your name and contact information.
3. There will be a drawing at the Historic Preservation Awards on Thursday, May 25, 2017. You don't need to be present to win, but you will need to pick up your prize in person.

This year, Visit Corvallis and PreservationWORKS are sponsoring a Geocaching Coin Challenge to honor Benton County's stories. Reading the information about the cache sites in the cache descriptions and on plaques on site will enhance your cultural experience.

Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor adventure using GPS-enabled devices. Navigate to specific coordinates and find the hidden container or answer a question about the site.

**RULES**

1. The cache sites have historic significance. The caches are NOT hidden in or on any historic structures, but are close enough to view them. Please help preserve our heritage by not touching the historic items and by only walking on sidewalks, paths, or grass.
2. Remember to sign the cache logs inside each container and to log your find online.
3. If you take something from the geocache, leave something of equal or greater value so others can enjoy the "treasure hunt" too.
4. One Geocoin per family.
5. Geocoins are limited and will be distributed while supplies last.
6. As with all Geocaching activities, you are responsible for your own safety as well as the safety of your children. Be careful and considerate.
