NEIL J. KAVANAGH 1/31/43 - 4/21/03

Mark's Dad had been fighting smallcelled cancer since he collapsed at work in November 2001. He had been the hospital/ nursing home since that time. The cancer was in his lungs and his brain. Rounds of radiation and Chemo slowed the progress and almost made

remission a few times, but it never went away.

Mark was there during his final days at Christ Hospital in Jersey City. He was for the most part in good spirits. He made an amazing transformation on the last day Mark talked to him. He accepted his fate and opened his arms to God and made peace with everybody. After Mark left him, to return home, Neil never woke up & passed on a couple of days later.

We had him cremated as per his request. A memorial service was held for him at his Church, Good Shepard Lutheran in Pearl River, NY.

The family interned his ashes into the Harlem Ship Canal (or often mistakenly called the Harlem River) at the upper tip of Manhattan. You may ask why here? It is off of Inwood Hill Park. Inwood is the section of Manhattan he grew up in. He always talked about the monument where the Dutch bought

Manhattan from the Indians, it is in their park. Another favorite topic of his was the "C" Rock. This is a rock that is painted for University directly Columbia across the river from Columbia's Baker's field, which happens to be next to Inwood Hill Park. Also across the river is Metro-North Railroad, which he also loved trains. It was a beautiful day when his ashes were spread into the river.

the Oursler's, long time family friend and across the street neighbors when the Ackley's lived at the famous "haunted" house at 1 LaVeta Place. Her ashes were spread into the Hudson from the Oursler's dock. At the following reception a slide show presentation of Helen's life was shown. It was


